## 2009 Fact Sheet

- Description:** St. Tammany Fire Protection District No. 11 was founded in 1975 in the town of Pearl River, Louisiana beginning with only one fire engine and a few volunteers. We have since grown to a fire department with 3 fire stations, more than 10 apparatus, support vehicles and equipment. St. Tammany Fire Protection District No. 11 has a rating of a 2 which great on the scale of 1-10, 1 being the best. Our fire protection district serves all of the incorporated area of the Town of Pearl River, LA as well as the immediate unincorporated area surrounding the Town of Pearl River, LA. We also serve interstate 59 from mile marker 3 to mile marker 7 and because of automatic mutual aid agreements with St. Tammany Fire Protection District No. 7; we also cover interstate 59 to the Louisiana, Mississippi state line. St. Tammany Fire Protection District No. 11 is also one of 3 fire protection districts in St. Tammany Parish that operates Advanced Life Support Emergency Medical Services ambulances.
- Location:** St. Tammany Fire Protection District No. 11's main operation is out of Station 112 which is located on highway 3081 at the corner of McQueen Rd. in the town of Pearl River, Louisiana. Station 111 is located at the corner of Pine St. Extension and Fogg Ln. and station 113 is located on E. Porter's River Rd. near interstate 59.
- Apparatus & Equipment**
- Station 111 houses multiple pieces of equipment. The main apparatus being engine 111, medic 111, service 111 and tanker 111. Station 111 also houses an ATV outfitted with a pump for wildland fire applications, and a mobile incident command trailer. Also housed on the grounds of station 111 is a classroom which is used for training as well as meetings and a training tower used for live fire training, rescue and other training applications.
- Station 112 houses engine 112, ladder 112, medic 112 and reserve medic 113. This station is also where the Fire Chief, Robert D. Crowe's office is located.
- Station 113 houses engine 113, a fire safety trailer used for fire prevention and public education as well as a mobile self contained breathing apparatus filling station.

St. Tammany Fire Protection District No. 11's call dispatch center is located in Slidell, Louisiana at their central fire station.

- Hours:** St. Tammany Fire Protection District No. 11 is a 24 hours, 7 days a week and 356 days a year operation. There is never anytime where our fire protection district is not covered by fire and E.M.S. personnel. Our business hours are typically 9am to 5pm, Monday through Friday, however we are always available to answer questions or to assist the public or other agencies anytime and in any way we can. We have access to several resources including a fire safety trailer which teaches children how to recognize the sound of a smoke alarm and how to react in the event of a fire in their home. We also have mascot named Sparky who drives his fire truck right into the program to assist with the public education. We have programs that are customizable for all age groups including the elderly.
